## 7. Regeneration MK 2030

In 2009 the Council launched its first Regeneration Strategy. This was updated in 2015 when a vision for the regeneration process in Milton Keynes up to 2030 was set out in the attached document (Item 7) (**Pages 17 to 36**).

The current Strategy is scheduled for a review and refresh during 2019/20 and this is an opportunity for the Committee to scrutinise, comment on, and, if

appropriate, make recommendations on any changes to the Strategy in order to feed into the revision process.

**8. Review of the ‘Big Conversation’**

To receive and comment on an oral report from the Director of Housing and Regeneration updating the Committee on the details of the conversation started in April with residents on estates scheduled for regeneration and setting out the residents’ proposals for a new approach to the regeneration process. A formal report on the “Big Conversation” will be presented to the Cabinet Regeneration Sub-Committee on 25 July 2019.
