Dear Anestis

I am contacting you as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act having been consulted on the application above.

Because of the location of the premises this application may well attract representations on the basis of noise causing a public nuisance but Environmental Health are the main authority to consider this and so I am not taking the matter forward myself as the licensing authority consultee having noted you have a 11pm curfew for the public to attend the premises.

However, I can see littering outside of the premises from patrons being a potential concern even with your 11pm restriction.

Whilst I would imagine most people would be taking away to consume at home there is still potential for people to discard litter outside of the premises.

I would therefore invite your client to accept a condition on the licence to the effect of:

'The licence holder will ensure that the area immediately outside of his premises (to the road) is kept clear of litter arising from his customers'

Whilst this condition will not stop littering in general its one small step we can take.

If you are content with this please let myself and Adam know, confirming that you are amending your application and do not require a hearing for it to be applied to the licence.
