Dear Iain

The applicant for the licence has come back to me with some changes to his application in an effort to address your concerns.

The changes offered are:

1. To do no take-away Sundays to Wednesday after 00:30 at night. This would reduce the 3am curfew time in terms of the public visiting but not on Thursdays to Saturdays. I think this doesn't go far enough. I could live with Friday and Saturday nights as that is the weekend, but Thursday is still a working week evening.
2. In terms of deliveries – no change of hours (so still 3am) but drivers and trained to operate without creating any noise / nuisance to public. The side entrance door will be used by delivery drivers and this door will not be for public use. I fail to understand why deliveries have to take place so late in the evening/or early morning. My experience to date living where I do is that delivery drivers are always noisy, and use noisy trucks and trollies. If the curfew for deliveries as set at 23:30 that would be acceptable.

Finally, (and I think you are clear on this already but I had best make sure), the following conditions on public nuisance are already due to be imposed:

There will be no customers on the premises after 00:30 on any day for consumption of food or alcohol (so takeaway and deliveries only after this time) Yes already aware of they, although as I said in my original representation, it is customers milling a round outside who are likely to be more of a nuisance!

If after considering these changes you would like to withdraw your representation then please let me know and I will impose these as requirements on any granted licence.
