## **COMMUNITY CARE PLAN**

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### **1. Purpose**

#### 4. **Background**

- 4.1 The Community Care Assembly on 24 June 1999 resolved that “The Community Care Plan 1998/2001 not be formally updated prior to April 2001, but that actions identified within the Plan should be reviewed and brought back to the next meeting of the Community Care Assembly.” This resolution was also agreed by the Neighbourhood Services Committee on 7 July 1999.
- 4.2 Nominations were invited from the membership of the Assembly to participate in this Review. Six people volunteered, although only two were able to attend the scheduled meetings.
- 4.3 The Recommendations made in the Community Care Plan 1998/2001 have been reviewed to identify which ones are still outstanding and which groups or planning processes are best placed to take them forward. The working document resulting from this review process is attached as an **Annex** to the report.
- 4.4 This working document quotes the original recommendations verbatim, although in many cases circumstances have moved on. The page references refer to the pages in the Community Care Plan. Lead Officers have been indicated for each recommendation.

#### 5. **Issues and Choices**

- 5.1 Within the detail of the recommendations there are many issues and choices. Members of the Assembly are encouraged to pick out any particular issues that they think merit discussion or alternatively to contact Lead Officers directly to discuss progress (or lack of it) on particular matters.
