To update the Health and Wellbeing Board on what is being done to further understand and improve these outcomes



1. Background

- 1.1 A set of system summary measures of success have been agreed and the full measures will be reported to the HWB on an annual basis. Measures are compared with other LAs of a similar deprivation level (4th least deprived decile) with an ambition target of the best 5%.
- 1.2 Baseline information was provided to the Health and Wellbeing Board in September 2018, and exceptions will be reported at each Health and Wellbeing Board meeting.
- 1.3 Exceptions highlighted will be based on any new data released since the previous Health and Wellbeing Board meeting and include those where:
 - The measure shows that Milton Keynes has changed from being similar to LA comparators previously and is now significantly worse than comparators or below the national target
 - The measure shows that Milton Keynes has changed from being significantly better than LA comparators and is now similar or worse than LA comparators
 - Measures where Milton Keynes remains significantly worse than LA comparators or below the national target
 - Any changes to previously agreed measures of success
- 1.4 All measures of success where Milton Keynes is significantly worse than LA comparators are summarised in the attached **Annex**

<p>Context and current system actions This data relates to the period 2015/17. MK has had a suicide prevention plan since 2017, with considerable multiagency working. Intervention plans have included an award-winning prevention programme on the Rail Network with confirmed prevention. Real time data shows that in 2018 we saw a reduced number of suicides locally though this is still an area of focus.</p>		<p>Context and current system actions The 127 hospital admissions for self-harm are statistically lower than the regional and national rate; and are very low up to 18 years. However we know that nationally only 1 in 8 young people present for treatment so much of self-harm is hidden and this needs to be addressed.</p>	
<p>HWB support requested The majority of our cases are amongst individuals who have been or are currently involved with mental health services, but are not necessarily inpatients. Although NHSE requires Trusts to submit an inpatient suicide prevention plan, the multiagency suicide prevention group has requested a broader plan to incorporate those who are not inpatients and this needs to be progressed.</p>		<p>HWB support requested That the HWB support the joint approach taken by the MK Safeguarding Board's Children's Programme Board in January 2019. This included an action plan to ensure a system-wide development of pathway, training and resources to support young people, their parents and schools to reduce the level of self harm and its consequences being implemented by a Task and Finish Group. Further information will be brought to the HWB as part of the Mental Health Needs Assessment.</p>	

4. Brief update on previous exceptions reported in November 2018

<p>Flu Vaccination</p> 	<p>A new vaccine was introduced for the over 65s this season and was delivered in batches. Earlier in the system there was anxiety about the lack of sufficient stocks and that the uptake might be lower than previous years. However, thanks to the excellent collaborative work with all key stakeholders across the system, we have been able to promote the uptake and the most recent data shows that we have achieved better uptake compared to similar time last year.</p>
<p>MMR Vaccination Coverage</p> 	<p>NHS England Screenings and Immunisations representative invited to HWB in June 2019.</p>
<p>Excess Winter deaths</p> 	<p>More recent data available with a reduction in excess winter deaths from and over-arching mortality review of health economy being taken to MKCCG Quality Committee on 29th January 2019.</p>
