Re: **Slate, 2 Secklow Gate, Central Milton Keynes**

I have reviewed the application for the above site. It is noted that the application is to extend the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol by one hour every Sunday (until 1am) and two hours Monday to Thursday (until 1am) and Fridays (until 2am), and extend the terminal hour for licensable activities including karaoke, live music and recorded music by one hour every Friday (until 2am). I have concerns as the applicant wishes to remove all conditions stated on pages 5-15 of the existing premises licence and have not proposed any new conditions.

The following conditions should not be removed from the licence:

- The licensee shall ensure that a person with a knowledge of basic first aid skills is available on the premises when open to members of the public.
- The licensee shall ensure that music provided at the premises shall not cause a nuisance to nearby residential accommodation.
- Any amplification of music shall, if so required by the Council, be maintained at a pre-set level to be determined by the Council.

In addition to the above I would recommend that the following condition is applied to the licence:

- The Licence Holder or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a log book kept for the purpose and shall include the time and date of checks, the person making them and the results including any remedial action.
