Existing Settlements

1st Joined up planning (15 votes)

- ◆ Access Government funding for housing improvement
- ◆ Inclusion (health and housing)
- ◆ Health of an increasing ageing population (provide opportunities for active accessible recreation)
- ◆ Demography of old settlements > needs support older people
- ◆ Counselling (voluntary) services increase links with mental health
- ◆ Targeting upgrades for vulnerable groups
- ◆ Local joint services
- ◆ People centred plans exist for the learning disabled
- ◆ Is the aids/adaptations budget sufficient for MK health needs?
- ◆ Closer working/planning/community safety, health and social care

2nd Regeneration (13 votes)

- ◆ Planning which tackles renewal – investment here and not just in growth areas!
- ◆ Needs to be tidied up
- ◆ Fit for purpose
- ◆ Regenerate
- ◆ Concerted effort to improve existing poor housing
- ◆ Improve standard of current accommodation
- ◆ Regeneration not be left behind
- ◆ Extensive housing stock age at same time development corporation legacy
- ◆ Who promotes government warm front grants (see who cares Winter edition)
- ◆ £73m at least for repairs

3rd Engaging Community (7 votes)

- ◆ Ask residents in e.g. Netherfield
- ◆ Build communities

4th Lifestyle (5 votes)

- ◆ Expansion of sport and leisure facilities
- ◆ Protection of 'green' area
- ◆ Obesity

5th Homelessness & support (4 votes)

- ◆ Decrease dependency on temp accommodation
- ◆ An end to bed & breakfast accommodation for vulnerable homeless people

- ◆ More tenant support schemes
- ◆ Increase tenancy support schemes

6th Transport

- ◆ Has adequate public transport support
- ◆ Transport
- ◆ Increase in road traffic accidents
- ◆ Public transport to local clinics

New Settlements

1st Strategic joined up planning (14 votes)

- ◆ Joined up health
- ◆ Joined up council
- ◆ Close partnership working between planning department and JHSCB
- ◆ Local services communities
- ◆ Small (ish) 2-bedroom dwellings to bring younger people to live here
- ◆ Mixed housing economy (families can live nearby)
- ◆ Diverse local amenities leisure, shops, transport etc.
- ◆ Community
- ◆ Infrastructure to support new community
 - Health centres
 - Arts/leisure
 - Parks
- ◆ Proper forward planning of primary care

2nd Social Inclusion (13 votes)

- ◆ Accommodation for people with mental health needs in new developments
- ◆ Technology to support frail or disabled
- ◆ Space needed for future housing needs – supported living/residential care
- ◆ Space in each new development for housing for people with special needs
- ◆ Partnerships with RSLs with expertise in housing for people with special needs
- ◆ Who ensures enough bungalows?
- ◆ Housing for people with special needs e.g. disabled/elderly
- ◆ Supported living schemes for mental health users

3rd Affordable energy efficient housing (11 votes)

- ◆ Affordable housing
- ◆ Need appropriate social housing tenure mix
- ◆ Affordable and energy efficient
- ◆ Sustainable
- ◆ Fuel efficient

4th Lifestyle (7 votes)

- ◆ Obesity
- ◆ Build for healthy lifestyles
- ◆ Local health and fitness facilities and open spaces
- ◆ Open spaces
- ◆ Skills/educational opportunities to reduce ill health and homelessness

5th Next Generation (5 votes)

- ◆ The demography of the new areas will create a high birth rate/ and issues around child health

6th Built Environment (1 vote)

- ◆ No prefabs
