# **MILTON KEYNES INTER-AGENCY CODE OF PRACTICE ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

Formulated by Members of the  
Milton Keynes Violence Against Women and Children Working Party

**Domestic Violence is the abuse experienced by people, particularly women and children**, which, is perpetrated by partners or ex-partners or by others with whom they are, or have been in a relationship, including carers. Domestic Violence is also experienced within the immediate and extended family. It includes psychological, financial, emotional, physical and sexual abuse.

**The impact of Domestic Violence on children is significant and far-reaching.** Children can be direct victims of the violence. They are also often traumatised as a result of witnessing the violence. The harm suffered by these children may be long-term, affecting their physical and psychological well being and impairing development in all spheres of life.

**The majority of perpetrators of Domestic Violence are men.** However, people in same sex and some men in heterosexual partnerships also experience Domestic Violence situations. Domestic Violence occurs across all social groups throughout society.

An anti-discriminatory approach is integral to all aspects of this Code of Practice.

## **Staff should:**

- Give priority to ensuring the immediate safety of the victim and children.
- Listen to the victim's report of violence and take it seriously.
- Not attribute responsibility for the violence to the victim; offenders are accountable for their own behaviour.
- Appreciate the potential danger of further violence and do not under-estimate the actual violence that exists toward the victim and the children.
- Let the victim know that support, information and guidance are readily available.
- Maintain up-to-date information about the rights of victims, particularly women and children, who are discriminated against in other aspects of life.
- Create a climate which encourages reporting of incidents of domestic violence by:
  - being accessible to the victim and children;
  - ensuring the safety of both the victim and children;
  - raising awareness of the issues of domestic violence within the community;
  - raising awareness of the issues of domestic violence within partner agencies; and
  - dealing with the victim and children in a caring, sensitive and professional manner
- Acknowledge and safeguard victims, children and young people's rights.
- Recognise and value the expertise of partner-agencies in the areas of domestic violence.

## **ALL AGENCIES SHOULD:**

- Work together on behalf of those suffering domestic violence, including children and young people, recognising each agency's responsibilities and limitations.
- Be aware of the issues, particular to specific ethnic and other minority groups, and ensure that culturally appropriate information and resources are available.
- Develop joint strategies for Milton Keynes response to domestic violence, including awareness raising and training.
- Link this Code of Practice to other relevant Policy or Strategy documents.
- Evaluate and monitor agency responses to domestic violence.

**Outcomes and performance measures relating to the implementation of this Code of Practice are described in the Milton Keynes Crime and Disorder Reduction Strategy .**

The Working Party's objectives for domestic violence are to:

- *develop an action plan to increase reporting of domestic violence to the police, by 10% by 31.03.01 and 25% by 31.03.02, including, if appropriate, use by reporting centres;*
- *prepare and launch a major publicity campaign aimed at increased reporting of domestic violence;*
- *produce a plan for a multi-agency approach to the investigation of referrals of domestic violence and work with victims of repeated violence;*
- *reduce great victimisation from recorded domestic violence by 10% by 31.03.01 and 25% by 31.03.02;*
- *facilitate two multi-agency training courses on domestic violence each year; and*
- *implement the objectives as resources permit.*
