

Noise Management Plan
Event: Together – Private Party
Date: 1st July 2017
Time: 12.00 – 02.00
Venue: Red House Lake, Newport Pagnell

We have employed a professional PA supplier for this private party who along with us acknowledge that we have a primary responsibility to ensure that we do not generate excessive noise disturbance. The purpose of this noise management plan is to detail the procedures we aim to adopt to ensure, as far as possible, the minimisation of disturbance to local residents.

Management of Amplified noise

Generally, the overriding requirement is for control of noise 'at source' by considering:

- The location and orientation of the event.
- The specification, selection and operation of amplified music equipment.
- Managing operations on site
- To agree target noise levels for the event and a maximum noise level not to be exceeded.

These will be measured by:

- Monitoring noise levels produced at source and ensuring these levels are not exceeded, taking into consideration ambient noise levels during the event and adjusting our on site noise levels accordingly.
- To monitor event noise at any noise sensitive locations, and to consider if subjectively it is too loud.
- We will pay particular attention to the Red House Park estate when monitoring off site levels as we understand the local authority received a couple of noise complaints from that area.
- We also intend to direct the amplified noise in a different direction this year, by pointing the PA system towards the M1 motorway.
- We intend to reduce the noise levels on site at 10.00pm to account for the reduction in ambient noise levels and then again at Midnight to a very low subtle on site level until 02.00am.
- The PA Company, R.C Sound Systems have been fully briefed on our requirements and expectations and will consistently work along side us to ensure noise levels are adhered to. This will be achieved by regular on site and off site monitoring, and liaising between the sound engineer and us the party organisers.
