Draft Crime Reduction Targets

The following table displays the complete draft crime and disorder reduction strategy. The targets are quantitative, representing outcomes that are designed to meet the strategic objectives. The completed actions are milestones that must be reached in order to achieve those outcomes. These milestones are generally arranged sequentially.

The strategy contains a compound of short, medium and long term targets. They are intended to be both challenging and attainable. Few, if any, of the targets can be achieved by one agency acting alone and the strategy, above all, envisages co-operative effort. Ultimately, such an approach should create a sustainable crime prevention culture.

Every aspect of the strategy stems from the findings of the crime audit in November 1998, together with the ensuing public and partnership consultation. Provision has been made within the strategy to continue to measure levels of crime and disorder in Milton Keynes and compare them with national trends. Continuous public consultation has also been built into the strategy in order to ensure that it operates appropriately.

The aim of the strategy is to reduce crime and disorder and the fear of crime in Milton Keynes. Its efficiency is likely to be affected by many different factors during the next three years, including resource availability, changing trends in criminal and social activity and developing government priorities. The targets will therefore require adjustment from time to time in order to reflect the wider environment. The ultimate success of the strategy will depend largely on how far it can be adapted to these external factors.
