Hospital admissions for Asthma (under 19 years)

Paediatric asthma admissions are significantly above the national average. This was highlighted in the key national benchmarking report, the Child Health Profile (2015) and a recent report by the Oxford Academic Health Science report (2014).

Actions are being taken by the CCG to reduce these admissions including:

- increasing families' confidence in caring for their children by offering consistent messaging across the asthma care pathway;
- identification and follow-up of children seen in primary care;
- development of a clear acute care pathway, supporting clinicians' to make good clinical decisions.

Progress in this area will be assessed through a repeat of the Oxford Academic Health Science Report and annual Child Health Profiles reports. Other more rapid measures, which can be used to indicate progress in this area are: reduced A&E attendances and admissions for respiratory illness; the evaluation of parent's confidence; evaluation of the Thames Valley training programme for primary care professionals on the management of childhood asthma.

Board Action required

CCG, LA and relevant voluntary organisations could ensure that the consistent messaging about care of children with asthma is shared more widely with schools, children's centres and other relevant venues.
