

SUMMARY DATA FOR SCHOOLS IN WEST BLETCHLEY AREA

1. The current NOR for the area is 1928 against a capacity of 2474, resulting in a surplus of 546 places;
2. The projected NOR for the area in 2009 is 1972 against a capacity of 2474, resulting on a surplus of 472 places;
3. Over the period 2003 to 2006, five of the eight schools have seen their NORs fall continually each successive year;
4. Whilst standards for the area are generally sound, of the six schools that have KS2 results, all but one of the six have had a Contextual Value Added (CVA) score of less than 100, (where 100 is what is the national median), for the last 3 years;
5. Standards trends demonstrate that four schools have an “up” trend, two a downward trend and two are constant;
6. Only one of the eight schools currently provides a fully extended offer of services to the community;
7. The accommodation condition backlog for the primary schools area ranges between £112 and £288 per square metre. The average for the Authority is £186 per square metre, and four of the schools are above this average;
8. The accommodation suitability works backlog for the primary schools in the area ranges between 30 and 177. The average index for the Authority is 101, and five of the schools are above this average;
9. Four schools are deemed ‘accessible’, one is broadly accessible and three have poor accessibility;
10. The revenue funding per pupil at the primary schools in the area ranges from £2536 per pupil to £3256 per pupil against a Milton Keynes average of £2858 per primary school.
11. An area within the defined area of Abbeys Primary School (Granby) had been identified by Surestart as a “super output area” due to its deprivation indices. It is expected that the Authority will seriously consider the provision of Children’s Centres within such an area to ensure that service are targeted at areas of greatest need.
12. A local authority day nursery within the Bletchley area will shortly be requiring new accommodation. Currently only two of the six infant and primary do not offer or have associated early years provision and these

are Chestnuts Primary and Holne Chase Primary. Holne Chase Primary is almost full.
