

Community Safety Partnership

Priority Crime Group (PCG)

Aims of Group

To reduce criminal damage and theft from vehicles by 20% by 31 March 2007. The baseline for this reduction will be the 6 months from April – September 2006.

Method of Operation

- The group will be led by Chief Inspector Andy Standen
- It will be accountable to the Community Safety Partnership
- Monthly reports will be submitted to the Performance Group of the CSP, highlighting achievements and barriers and progress
- The group will be multi-agency, consisting of representatives of:
 - Thames Valley Police (criminal damage and vehicle crime)
 - Safer Communities Unit
 - Streetcare (MKC)
 - Waste (MKC)
 - Education
 - Housing
 - Fire Service
 - Communications
 - CSP
- The PCG will meet weekly in order to co-ordinate activity across agencies
- It will develop a plan based on the crime reduction triangle. Details below.

Data Requirements

Data on vehicle crime and criminal damage will be available from the following sources:

- Thames Valley Police – crime data, detections
- Milton Keynes Council – reports of graffiti, damage
- Bucks Fire & Rescue – fire data
- Safer Communities Unit – enforcement action

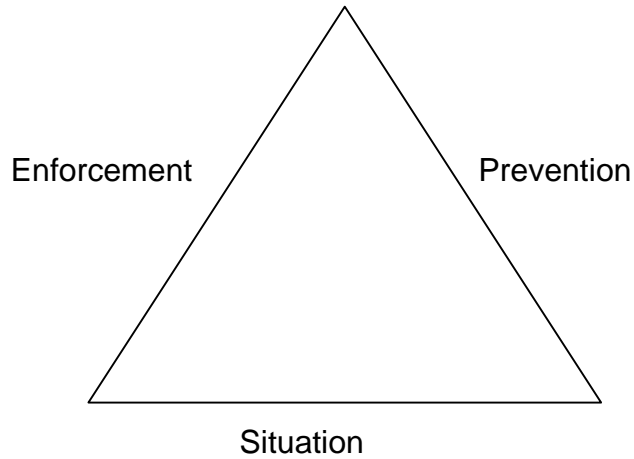

Evaluation

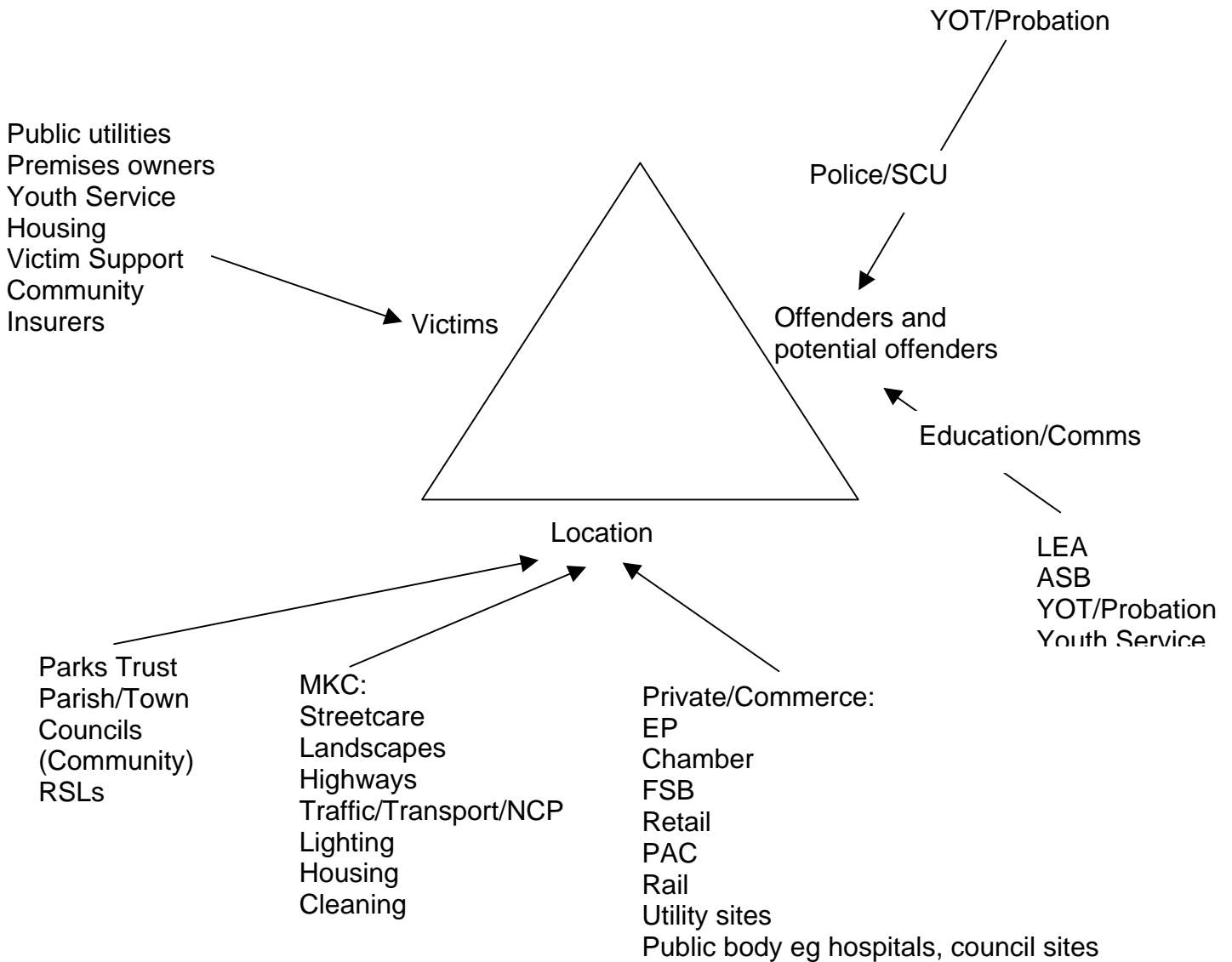
Final evaluation report in March 2007 to be submitted to JATAC.
