

Briefing Note for Strategic Place Making Scrutiny Committee Meeting- 26 July, 2018

‘Mobility Strategy – An Action Plan Detailing Progress’

On 26th July 2018, Strategic Place Making Scrutiny Committee is considering the topic ‘Mobility Strategy – An Action Plan Detailing Progress’.

The Action Plan is due to be considered by Cabinet at their meeting in September 2018. This follows the meeting in March 2018 where the Mobility Strategy 2018-2036 was approved and referred to Council for adoption. As part of this Cabinet requested an action plan be brought back to their September meeting, and also that the Head of Transport develop a statement of engagement. The Action Plan will include information on the engagement activity that will be undertaken as part of the actions to implement the Mobility Strategy.

The Action Plan will clarify how the high level strategy outlined in March will be translated into more detailed activities that will feed into annual implementation plans, budget setting process, and future funding bids.

The Action Plan will do this by:

- Mapping the broad interventions listed in the Mobility Strategy against a suite of supporting strategies, and outline a timetable for the adoption of updated supporting strategies. To make best use of available resources this updating exercise will build on existing (LTP3) strategies and either fully refresh these, or undertake a more light touch review and agree an updated position statement.
- Explaining the process for undertaking a fresh assessment of significant infrastructure scheme priorities. This is being taken forward in 2018/19 through the development of a Transport Infrastructure Plan.
- Clarifying the interrelationship between the Mobility Strategy and its implementation with the Futures 2050 projects.
- Outlining how the implementation of the Mobility Strategy will be monitored and reported on.
- Explaining how the mobility strategy implementation plan will interact with the development and delivery of East West Rail, the Oxford Cambridge Expressway, the work being undertaken on the Housing Infrastructure Fund bid to support delivery of growth east of the M1, and further work on Plan:MK.

For all the activity above the opportunities for meaningful engagement with stakeholders will be outlined, to ensure detailed implementation proposals have been subject to consideration by a broader audience before inclusion in any programme of work.
