What is Overview and Scrutiny?

Each local authority is required by law to establish an overview and scrutiny function to support and scrutinise its executive arrangements.

Each scrutiny committee or review group has its own remit as set out in its terms of reference but they each meet to consider issues of local importance and have a number of key roles:

1. Providing a critical friend challenge to policy makers and decision makers
2. Enabling the voice and concerns of the public
3. Driving improvement in public services.

The scrutiny committees consider issues by receiving information from and the questioning of both council officers and external witnesses / partners to develop an understanding of proposals or practices. As scrutiny committees have no executive powers they often present their conclusions in the form of recommendations to the Cabinet, full Council, council officers, or external partners that they believe will improve performance, or as a response to public consultations. The Committee will often request a formal response and progress report on the implementation of recommendations that they have provided to various parties.

Attending Meetings of Scrutiny Committees / Task and Finish Groups

Meetings of scrutiny committees and task and finish groups are held in public and are open for everyone to attend. If you would like to attend then please just turn up. However, if you would like to make a representation to councillors on behalf of yourself or others, then let us know you are attending before the meeting so that the Chair can be advised in advance.

If there are specific issues that the meeting must consider in private then they will be asked to agree this at the meeting.

The Scrutiny process aims to promote the five themes and priorities set out in the Milton Keynes Council Corporate Plan

The Corporate Plan and framework sets out the vision for Milton Keynes. It captures what type of place Milton Keynes aspires to be for all those who live, work, learn and visit here. The plan sets out ambitious objectives for Milton Keynes including achieving world class status for its design, new approaches and technologies and as a sporting city.

It has five key themes which help communicate all the work the Council does on behalf of the residents of the borough.

The five themes are:

Cleaner, greener, safer, healthier MK:

Improve health and well-being, reduce health inequalities and work with partners to reduce crime and disorder to improve quality of life in MK.

Visiting MK:

Aim to make Milton Keynes a highly regarded visitor destination with a safe and effective transport system which is easily accessible regionally, nationally and internationally.

Working in MK:

To improve the skills and opportunities of everyone in Milton Keynes and help jobseekers into work, while attracting and retaining businesses to provide new opportunities and to bring people, jobs and industries to MK to improve the strength and resilience of the local economy.

Living in MK:

Ensuring people are satisfied with Milton Keynes as a place to live, and to support them effectively through the provision of high quality and efficient public services.

World Class MK:

Our ambition is to increase the international and national standing of Milton Keynes in several areas including our economic success, thriving communities and a high quality environment.

General Terms of Reference for Scrutiny Committees and Task and Finish Groups

- (a) To review or scrutinise any decision made, or other action taken, in connection with the discharge of any of the Executive Functions within the remit of the committee or task and finish group.
- (b) To make reports or recommendations to the Council or to the Cabinet with respect to the discharge of any of the Executive Functions within the remit of the committee or task and finish group.
- (c) To review or scrutinise any decision made, or other action taken, in connection with the discharge of any of the Non-executive Functions within the remit of the committee or task and finish group.
- (d) To make reports or recommendations to the Council or any Committee of the Council with respect to the discharge of any of the Non-executive Functions within the remit of the committee or task and finish group.
- (e) To make reports or recommendations to the Council, to the Cabinet or to a regulatory committee on matters within the remit of the committee or task and finish group which affect the Council's area or the inhabitants of the Council's area.
- (f) To consider any representations made in connection with the work of the committee or review group by a Member of the Council on behalf of her/his constituents.
- (g) To appoint advisers from outside the Council to advise the committees or task and finish groups.

Health and Adult Social Care Committee Terms of Reference

1. To assist in the provision of improved health and adult social care services to the residents of Milton Keynes by supporting the development of evidence based policies and strategies by the Council, health service providers and their partners.
2. To scrutinise the provision of services, the achievement of targets and the provision of resources to this end.
3. In particular, to carry out the Council's statutory scrutiny functions as the designated Health Scrutiny Committee.

5. **Update on the Milton Keynes and Bedfordshire Strategic Healthcare Review**

Representatives of the Milton Keynes Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) have been invited to attend the meeting in order to update the Committee on the progress of the ongoing Healthcare Review.

Over the past few months the Milton Keynes CCG and Bedfordshire CCG have continued to work together with their partners NHS England, Monitor, and the NHS Trust Development Authority, on possible options for the future delivery of healthcare services in this region. A briefing note updating the Committee on this work is attached at Item 5 **(page 15)**.

The work has been overseen by a board made up of representatives from all five partners, and the board considered the outcomes of the latest phase of the Healthcare Review at a regional meeting on 23 September. An update from this meeting is **to follow**.

This update will also be presented to the Bedfordshire (Bedford Borough and Central Bedfordshire Council) Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 28 September.

6. **Learning Disability Services Planning Ahead – A Consultation**

The Council undertook a strategic review of learning disability services in 2012, at which time the recommendations were not taken forward. However, the review provided evidence of a traditional service delivery model, which potentially minimises the capacity for service users to exercise their right to choice and to be in control of how their care needs are met.

As such, further up-to-date and in-depth analysis has been undertaken in 2015, to determine the appropriateness not only of the service provision but of the cost as well.

The aim of the refreshed work programme is to deliver modern learning disability services to ensure the following outcomes:

- People with learning disabilities will have true choice and control over their lives including: how they spend their time during the day, evening and weekends; where and with whom they want to live; and to be supported to work;
- People with learning disabilities will have improved health and wellbeing outcomes;
- Individuals with complex needs will access high quality, safe and specialist health and social care services when required;
- The transition from child to adult services will be smooth, planned and effective for all people with a learning disability;
- Carers will be recognised and valued as fundamental to strong families and stable communities;
- Safeguarding will continue to be of paramount importance. Milton Keynes Council will prevent abuse whenever possible, minimizing its impact by responding appropriately and quickly to any abuse of people with learning disabilities;
- Associated Equality Impact Assessments will be completed for each aspect of service consultation.

On 13 July Cabinet considered a report on the provision of learning disability services which included plans for the consultation process. Cabinet agreed the recommendations as set out in section 1 of the report, which is attached at Item 6a (**pages 16 to 20**).

A summary of the current Milton Keynes Learning Disability Service, called "Planning Ahead", is included as Item 6b (**pages 21 to 30**).

Following the Cabinet's decision, the Joint Commissioning Team is now consulting with service users, family carers, staff, stakeholders and young people who will use learning disability services in the future, asking what they think about the services and what could work better for them in their lives.

The consultation brief is included as Item 6c (**pages 31 to 32**).

This is a chance for the Committee to consider the proposals and feed into the consultation process.
