<p>Priority Focus 1: Reduce Domestic Abuse - Updated Q3</p> <p>Reports of Domestic Abuse to Thames Valley Police have remained relatively stable during the last 2 available reporting periods. During the quarter covering April to June 2015, 1815 reports of domestic abuse were recorded. The subsequent quarter recorded a minor increase of 4.08% - to 1889 reports.
