# Milton Keynes school population

- **47,099 children and young people recorded in Jan 2018 school census.**
- **On roll at 112\* schools**
  - 2 nursery, 90 primary, 11 secondary, 6 special, 2 Pupil referral units, 1 All through school
- **10.3% of children in Milton Keynes schools known to be eligible for and claiming free school meals (England 13.6%)**
- **43% - Minority ethnic pupils\*\* in MK (England 32%)**

Attainment is expressed as the 'average point score per A level entry' and as an average grade.

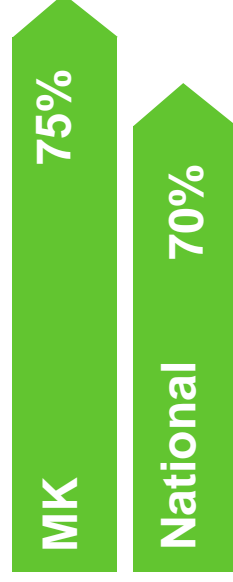

# Further information

## Headlines

### Key stage 1

Reading and maths have fallen whereas writing has improved. It needs to be noted this cohort is very small and has high levels of SEND.

### Key stage 2

All maintained in reading writing and a slight increase in maths.  
The combined figure continues to increase.

### Key stage 4

The overall English and Maths combined has improved slightly  
The numbers of young people who took GCSE English and Maths (entered and achieved group) has remained stable which with the changes to GCSE this year is a successful result.

### The not entered group: 11 young people

8 of these young people have an ECHP and attend specialist provision  
2 are UASC, one of whom achieved A\* in his home language

1 is a young person who was offered a creative package to meet their needs including an alternative provision.
