Good afternoon,

I would like to make a representation to this application on behalf of Environmental Health regarding noise disturbance.

I have reviewed the application and very little attention has been given regarding the Prevention of Public Nuisance, particularly given that the intention is to have music at the venue as late as 00:30 hours. There is clearly potential for public nuisance due to noise.

The previous Premises Licence (now surrendered) for this premises had several condition pertaining to noise. I attach a list of the noise related conditions on the previous licence. I would also recommend a condition requiring the licence holder to provide a telephone number for local residents to call to report noise complaints about the venue.

If the applicant will agree to the requested conditions I will consider withdrawing my representation.

## **Agreed Conditions**

1. The sound limiting device at the premise shall be checked and adjusted as considered appropriate in order to ensure that noise from entertainment does not cause a Public Nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive residential dwelling
2. All external windows and doors shall remain closed during regulated entertainment except for access and egress or emergencies.
3. The Licence Holder or his representative shall conduct regular assessments of the noise coming from the premise on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment and shall take steps to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a disturbance to local residents.
4. A written record shall be made of those assessments in a logbook kept for the purpose and shall include the time, date, and detail the person making them and the results including any remedial action taken.
5. A member of staff will be on the main exit door at the close of business each day the premise is being used for Licensable Activities. The member of staff will request that customers leave quietly and help to minimise any noise disturbance caused by patrons in the car park
6. The Premise Licence holder shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that all vehicles (and in particular coaches and stretched limousines belonging to his patrons) do not obstruct the public highway or access to adjacent private property, and that the arrival and departure of patrons is so far as practical conducted without nuisance to nearby residents. This will include effective management of the arrival and departure of entertainment staff (performers etc) and their equipment to ensure that noise is minimised
